NHN Funds

Neighborhood Healing Network

- ARCHS was granted \$1 million to oversee the Neighborhood Healing Network that works through five nonprofit hubs, it began in late August.
- The grant allows staff at Mission: St. Louis to identify if participants have been impacted by trauma and provide them with resources available to overcome barriers to education and employment.

CARES Act

Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security

- The CARES Act was granted to provide assistance to people impacted by COVID-19 and are at threat of eviction or homelessness with rental or mortgage assistance
- We have hired two new people to help navigate the application process.
- Originally we applied to help 35 people, that number is now over 300.

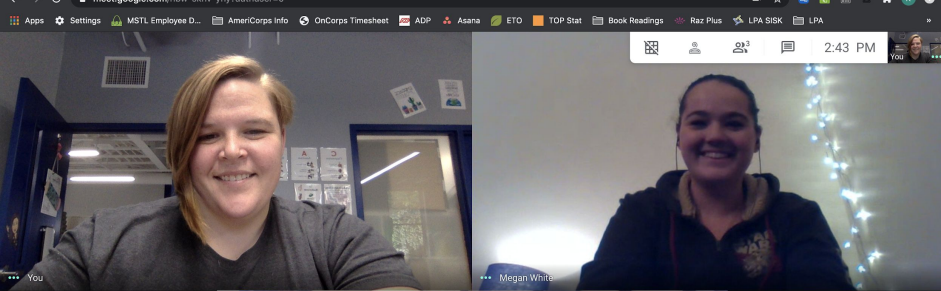
AMP Groups coming up...

- ChurchHouse - Webster Groves

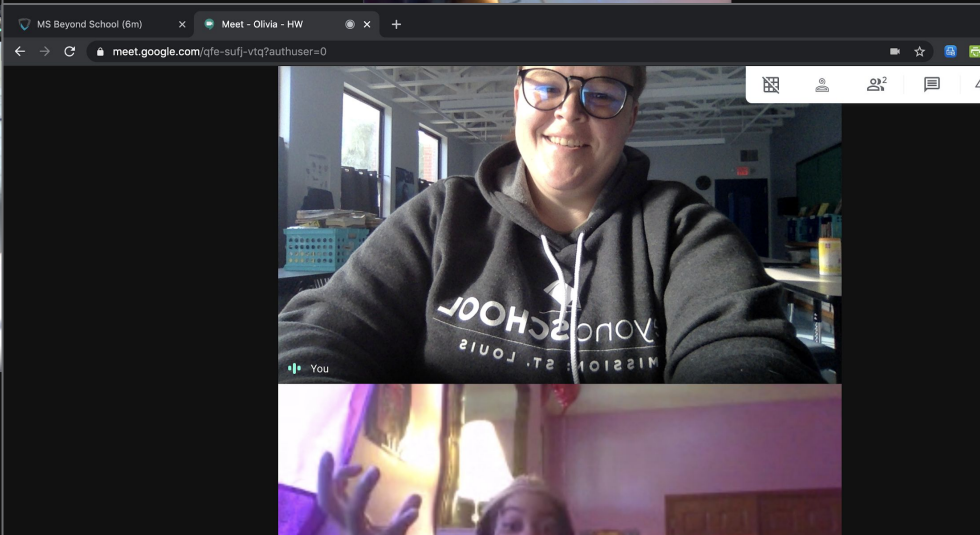
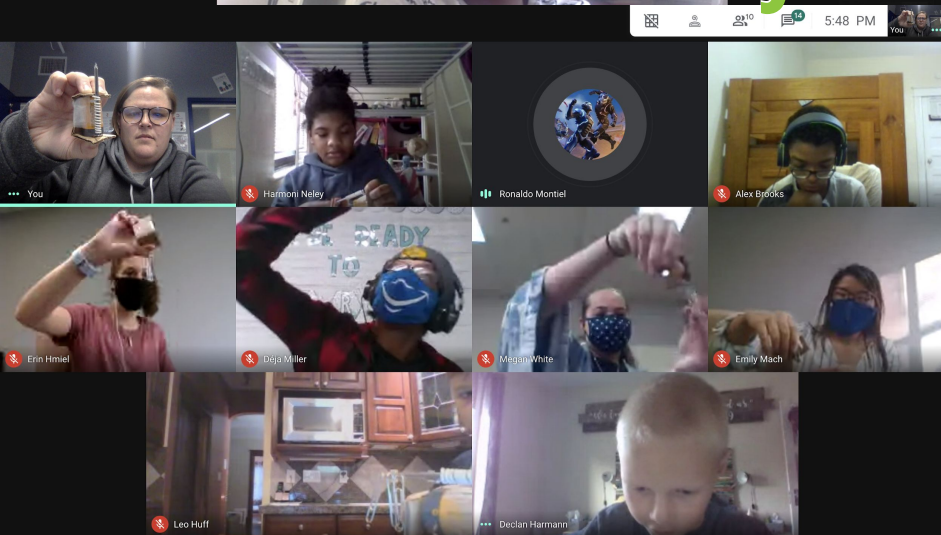
Healthy Home Repair
