## **NHN Funds**

### **Neighborhood Healing Network**

- ARCHS was granted \$1 million to oversee the Neighborhood Healing Network that works through five nonprofit hubs, it began in late August.
- The grant allows staff at Mission: St. Louis to identify if participants have been impacted by trauma and provide them with resources available to overcome barriers to education and employment.

## **CARES** Act

Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security

- The CARES Act was granted to provide assistance to people impacted by COVID-19 and are at threat of eviction of homelessness with rental or mortgage assistance
- We have hired two new people to help navigate the application process.
- Originally we applied to help 35 people, that number is now over 300.


### AMP Groups coming up...


## Healthy Home Repair
